Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open for reservable stays from the first weekend in May through the last weekend in October.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Showers, dump station, group area and a separate beach for campers are available. A family group campsite is available that has 2 adirondack shelters and can fit up to 40 people. A camp store also offers canoe and kayak rentals.

About the Policies

- Those with reservations, must register at the campground office between 1pm-8pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- There is a 14 consecutive night stay maximum limit.
 - Payment is due upon registration and may be made by cash, voucher, money order, Mastercard, Visa or Discover.
 - The site fee includes two adults and dependant children under 18.
 - After checking out you may use any beach on weekdays and Saturdays; on Sundays only the Camper's Beach. Trailers may be parked in the shower building parking lot behind the office.
 - Visitors must pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
 - Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am. Generators may be run between the hours of 9-12 am and 5-8 pm.
 - Pets must be leashed and attended to at all times. If a pet creates a disturbance or threatens patrons or staff, it will be removed from the park.
 - Pets are not permitted at the beach, including beach parking lots and adjacent Beaver Pond.
 - Dumpsters for trash deposit are located in the shower building parking lot (see map). Please recycle comingled cans, plastic and glass.
 - Do not wash dishes or brush teeth at the outside water stations. Do not wash dishes in the bathroom sinks.
 - Cutting standing trees or their limbs and using power saws is prohibited.
 - RVs are not permitted in group areas.
 - Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. It is unlawful to bring firewood from out-of-state locations. (RSA 227-K:17).

Activities

Campers enjoy swimming, picnicking, fishing, canoeing, kayaking, and hiking.

For Your Safety

Do not invite wildlife into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site, dispose of food waste properly and secure all food and heavily scented items in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons or destroyed by bears.

Making a Reservation

Reservations may be made by calling ReserveAmerica at 1-877-647-2757 or online at nhstateparks.org. Reservations for organized youth group camping are required and should be made by calling ReserveAmerica at 1-877-647-2757. Youth group reservations are not available online.
