Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open May 1st to October 31st. Campsite and pavilion reservations can be made 11 months in advance. Holiday reservations and any reservations made before April 1st for the next season are subject to a 3 night minimum.

About the Policies

- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am. Excessive noise at ANY TIME is not permitted. If site occupants are notified of excessive noise and do not cooperate, all occupants will be subject to immediate eviction, without refund. If a neighboring site is causing a disturbance after hours, please call the tollbooth number. The tollbooth is open until midnight 7 days a week during peak season, weather depending.
- Generators are permitted 9 am 12 pm (noon) and 5 8 pm.
- Site fees cover 2 adults and 4 dependent children (excluding family sites, cabins, and youth groups). All additional adults beyond 2 will be charged a fee of \$10 per adult per night.
- Any payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, gift card, gift certificate or debit/credit card. Day guests of registered campers must pay the day-use fee at the tollbooth and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours (8 am to 10 pm).
- Pets are not permitted at the beach or campground from May 1st to September 30th.Check-in is after 1 pm.
- Check-out time is 11 am. Campers must confirm check-out with office staff by 11 am.
- Camping equipment must be set up on the designated dirt portion of campsites, adjacent to the picnic table and fireplace.
- Alcohol is not permitted in the day-use area.
- Help protect the campground trees. Do not drive nails into trees, cut any standing trees, or remove tree limbs.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations due to invasive species.
- Campers are responsible for bringing their trash and recyclables to the dump area.
- There are no RV hook-ups or dump stations at Pawtuckaway State Park.
- RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- Two car maximum at standard campsites. Extra vehicles can be parked at the Visitor Center or Beach Parking Lots.

Activities

Enjoy hiking, biking, fishing, boating, climbing and swimming.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Each campsite has an open fireplace, picnic table, flat area for a tent, and a parking space. Running water, flush toilets, a camp store, boat launch, and canoe and kayak rentals are available.

For Your Safety

Do not invite raccoons, ducks, or other wildlife to the beach or into the campground. Keep the park clean by disposing of food waste properly and securing all food items into your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by hungry raccoons. Do not feed wildlife or waterfowl.
