Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend. First come/first served walk-ins are welcome.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Flush toilets, coin-operated showers, and a camp store are offered.

Activities

Enjoy swimming, picnicking, and biking. Trout fishing is excellent in many nearby streams. The park is a great base for hiking in the Presidential Range and visiting Mt. Washington.

Making a Reservation

Reservations may be made by calling ReserveAmerica at I-877-647-2757 or online at nhstateparks.org. Reservations for organized youth group camping are required and should be made by calling the Concord Office at (603) 27I-3556.

About the Policies

- Check-in time is between 1 pm and 8 pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- The park accepts cash, voucher, money order, Mastercard, Visa or Discover.
- Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- Pets are permitted in the campground only, not in the day-use area. Pets must be leashed and attended to at all times.
- Do not wash dishes or brush teeth at campsite water faucets as it attracts wildlife. Please use the dishwashing station and sinks provided at the toilet/ shower building.
- Although there are no hook-ups, recreational vehicles are welcome in sites where they fit.
- Your camping permit must be presented at the day-use area for free swimming and picnicking. Swimming is permitted only when the day-use area is open.
- Pets, RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.

For Your Safety

Do not invite bears or raccoons into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site by disposing of food waste and scraps properly. Be sure to remove all food items from tables and tents, and secure them in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons or destroyed by bears.
