

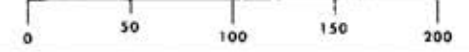
LAKE FRANCIS STATE PARK

PITTSBURG, NEW HAMPSHIRE

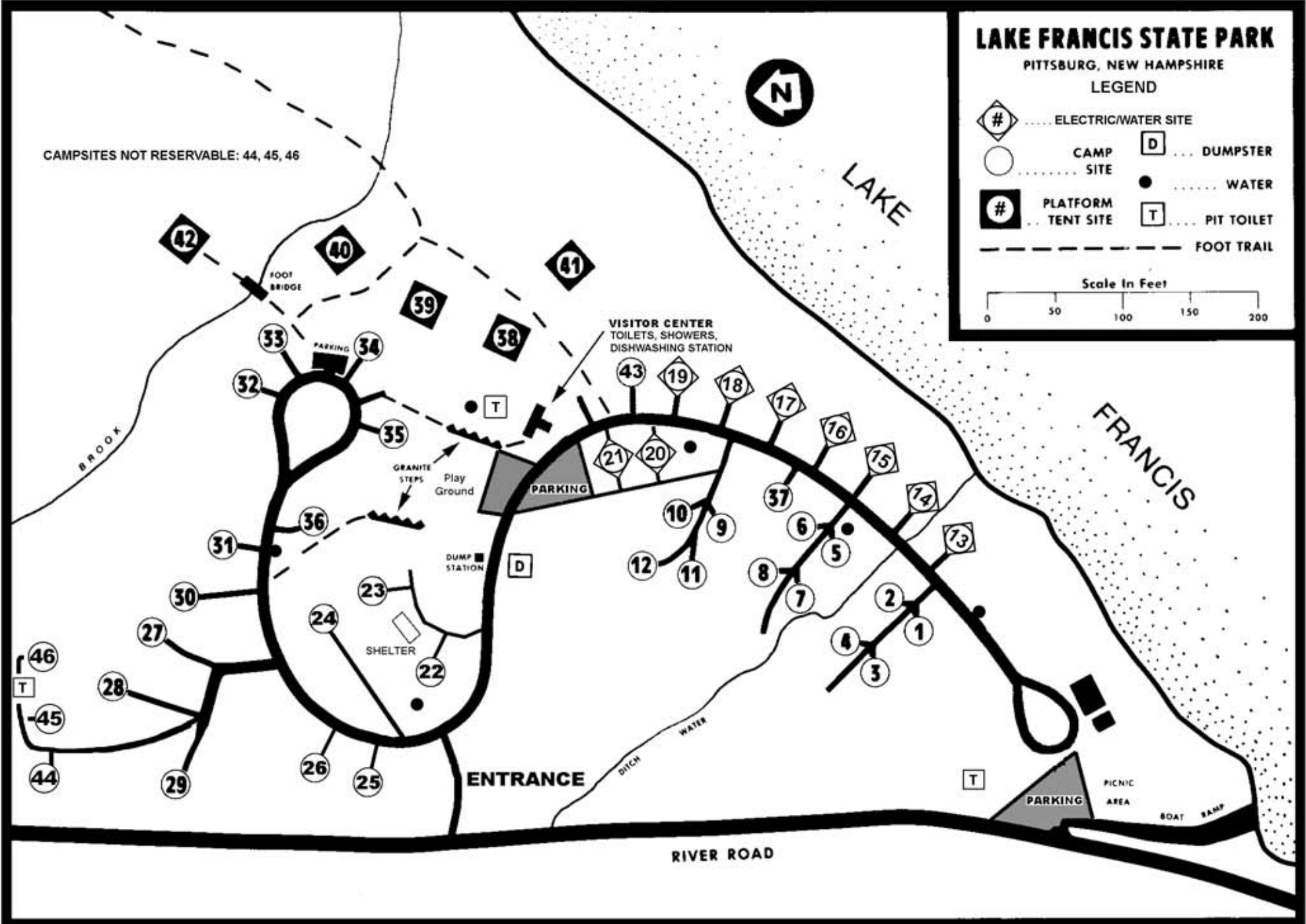
LEGEND

Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Five of the campground's 43 sites are walk-in. They are situated near the river, have tent platforms and are about a two-minute walk from the parking area. Each campsite has a fireplace, picnic table, flat area for a tent, and a parking space. A boat launch is located in the day-use area of the park. Running water, flush toilets, coin-operated showers and a dump station are centrally located. Kayak and canoe rentals are available. Late fall campers should be aware that there is no running water in the campground from mid-October for the remainder of the season.

Activities

The park is a good base for exploring the North Country. Campers also enjoy fishing and canoeing.

About the Policies

- Campers with a reservation must check in at the campground office between 1pm and 8 pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- If the campground office is not open upon arrival, campers should register at the self-registration station. Please fill in the information requested in the envelope provided, enclose the fee, and deposit in the designated slot.
- Payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, money order, traveler's check, Visa, Mastercard, or Discover.
- Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- After checking out, campers are welcome to park and spend the remainder of the day in the day-use area.
- Pets are permitted in the campground; they must be leashed and attended to at all times.
- Do not wash dishes or brush teeth at the water stations.
- Cutting standing trees and shrubs and using power saws is prohibited.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.

For Your Safety

Do not invite bears or raccoons into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site by disposing of food waste and scraps properly. Be sure to remove all food items from tables and tents, and secure them in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons or destroyed by bears.
