First Annual Motorcycle Run and Family and Friends' Day

Londonderry, NH, August 27, 2010 – The Family Readiness Group of the 94th Military Police Unit invites bike riders and families with children to participate in the First Annual Motorcycle Run and Family and Friend's Day at Pawtuckaway State Park, 128 Mountain Road (off NH Rte. 156), Nottingham, NH, on Saturday, September 11, 2010, from 9 am to 5 pm.

The Motorcycle Run begins at the park with registration at 9 am. The registration fee is \$20 per motorcycle (\$5 per additional passenger) and includes a barbecue following the run. The ride will pass through the towns of Nottingham, Raymond, Deerfield Center, and Northwood. The ride finishes at the park at about noon, at which time riders and the general public are invited to a barbecue served by the Rear Guard of the 94th Military Police. For non-riders, the cost of the barbecue is \$5 per person, \$20 for a family of five. Following the barbecue there will be organized sporting events for children and adults, including a fishing derby for children under 13 years of age. Special prizes will be awarded to participants. Pawtuckaway State Park features a playground, ball fields, a pavilion, hiking trails, and a swimming beach.

The recent return of US combat forces notwithstanding, America continues Operation Iraqi Freedom by training Iraqi police and security forces. This mission is being carried out by nearly 50,000 troops, including the 94th Military Police, an Army Reserve Unit based in Londonderry, NH. The Family Readiness Group exists to support spouses, children, and parents of deployed soldiers with social activities, and to prepare care packages for their soldiers. September 11, 2010, is the ninth anniversary of the "Nine Eleven" attacks in New York, Washington, and Pennsylvania, and is occasion to pause to remember those who died and suffered from the attacks, to take stock of America's response to those attacks, and to support its sons and daughters who serve their country with commitment and honor.
