

New Hampshire State Park Plate

Frequently Asked Questions

When is the NH State Parks license plate available for purchase?

Starting May 2, 2011 the plate will be available at Division of Motor Vehicles and its sub-stations. By the end of May, Town Clerk Offices will have the plate available.

Where can I get the NH State Parks license plate?

The plate is available at Division of Motor Vehicles and its sub-stations. By the end of May, Town Clerk offices will also have the plate available for purchase by state residents.

What is the cost of the NH State Parks license plate?

The annual fee for the NH State Park license plate is \$85.00 in addition to normal registration fees, plus a one-time new plate fee of \$8.00.

What are the benefits of purchasing the NH State Parks license plate?

Free admission is granted to cars that have a valid State Park license plate on the car. The holder of a State Parks license plate will receive free admission for the registered vehicle and its passengers to day-use parks including:

What are the restrictions?

The NH State Parks license plate does not include free or reduced fees for camping, parking meters, Cannon Mountain Aerial tramway, Flume Gorge, or the Mt. Washington Auto Road. Also, there is no discount to state employees for the purchase of the plate.

How does the NH State Parks license plate benefit state parks?

All revenues earned from the purchase of the NH State Parks license plate will be credited to the State Park Fund which supports the daily operations of the NH State Parks system.

I have a Conservation License Plate (also known as the “Moose Plate”). Is it possible to still help conserve New Hampshire’s natural, historical and cultural heritage and support New Hampshire State Parks with my license plate purchase?

You can do both! You can get a combination plate that will have both the Moose Plate and the State Park plate logos on it. The annual cost would be \$85.00 for the State Park fee and \$30.00 for Moose Plate fee in addition to normal registration fees, plus a one-time new plate fee of \$8.00.
