





SCA New Hampshire AmeriCorps Field Season Report The Student Conservation Association in Partnership with NH Department of Natural & Cultural Resources—NH Parks

Introduction:

During the 2018 season the SCA NH AmeriCorps Conservation Crew completed 16 hitches at various NH state parks. In total the crews worked in 16 different state parks accomplishing a variety of tasks including spring clean-up in campgrounds, shelter building, trail improvements, vegetation removal, bridge building, invasive species removal, and painting.

Accomplishments:

2018 was a wonderful season with great projects and excellent crews! Together we improved over 10.4 miles of trails, 60.89 acres of land, and constructed 11 structures in NH Parks. Here is a summary of the various projects we completed throughout the NH State Parks system. Included is work done in parks during trainings, fee-for-service hitch work, and Bear Brook/Spruce Pond Camp improvements.
