CONNECTICUT LAKES HEADWATERS WORKING FOREST RULES



Fires Prohibited (7301.14)

Fires are not allowed on this property.



Camping Prohibited (7302.02)

Camping is not allowed on this property.



Carry-in/Out (7301.15)

Visitors shall take all items brought with them, including waste material upon their departure, except where trash receptacles are provided.



Leashed Animals Permitted with Restrictions (7301.08)

Animals are permitted with restrictions and must be leashed and/or under the control of their handlers. Animal owners shall clean up and remove all animal waste.



Hunting Permitted with Restrictions (7301.10)

Hunters are advised to read RES 7301.10. Firearms shall not be discharged within 300 feet of developed recreation areas when occupied.



Target Shooting Permitted with Restrictions (7301.11)

Target Shooters are advised to read RES 7301.11. Target shooting shall not occur within 300 feet of developed recreation area. Shooting of glass bottles, household appliances or standing trees is strictly prohibited.



Natural and Cultural Resources (7301.05, 7301.06, 7301.19, 7301.20)

No person shall remove, damage, deface, disturb any structure, plant, marine or freshwater aquatic life, or geological feature on DNCR property. The use of metal detectors and digging is restricted and users must obtain permission.



OHRV and Snowmobile Trail Restrictions (8502.03)

No person shall operate an OHRV (ATV or trailbike) or snowmobile except in areas or trails established by the Bureau of Trails for OHRV or snowmobile use.

These rules apply to all State of New Hampshire Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (DNCR) properties and to all conservation or trail easement properties held by DNCR (7301.01) including the Connecticut Lakes Headwaters Forest Legacy Easement. Any person violating any rule contained in RES 7300 or RES 8500 shall be guilty of a violation (7301.04).
