Fairy houses are just one example of ephemeral art; sand castles are also ephemeral art (and could even be considered fairy houses!). Ephemeral art is super cool because it looks a little different each time we do it. When we engage in this art form, it is important to remember that we shouldn't take any living organisms and stick to the things that have already fallen to the ground (dead and down) that way we don't hurt any of the little plants and animals while they do their best to grow.

So, now that you are ready to build your very own fairy home, how should you do it?

- 1. Choose Your Building Location ~ Maybe the nook of a tree trunk or a hollow old stump could be the perfect spot!
- 2. Gather Materials ~ Be sure to choose plant materials that are already dead and down (Do your best not to pick living plants)
