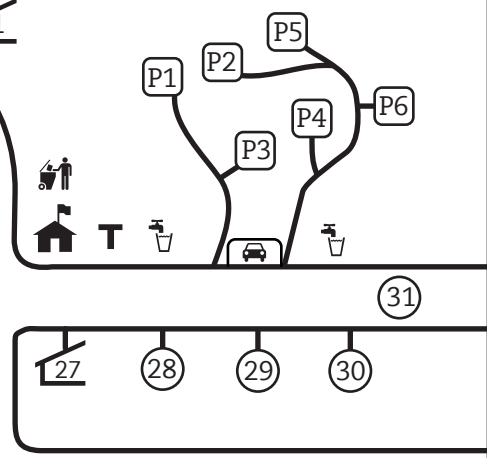
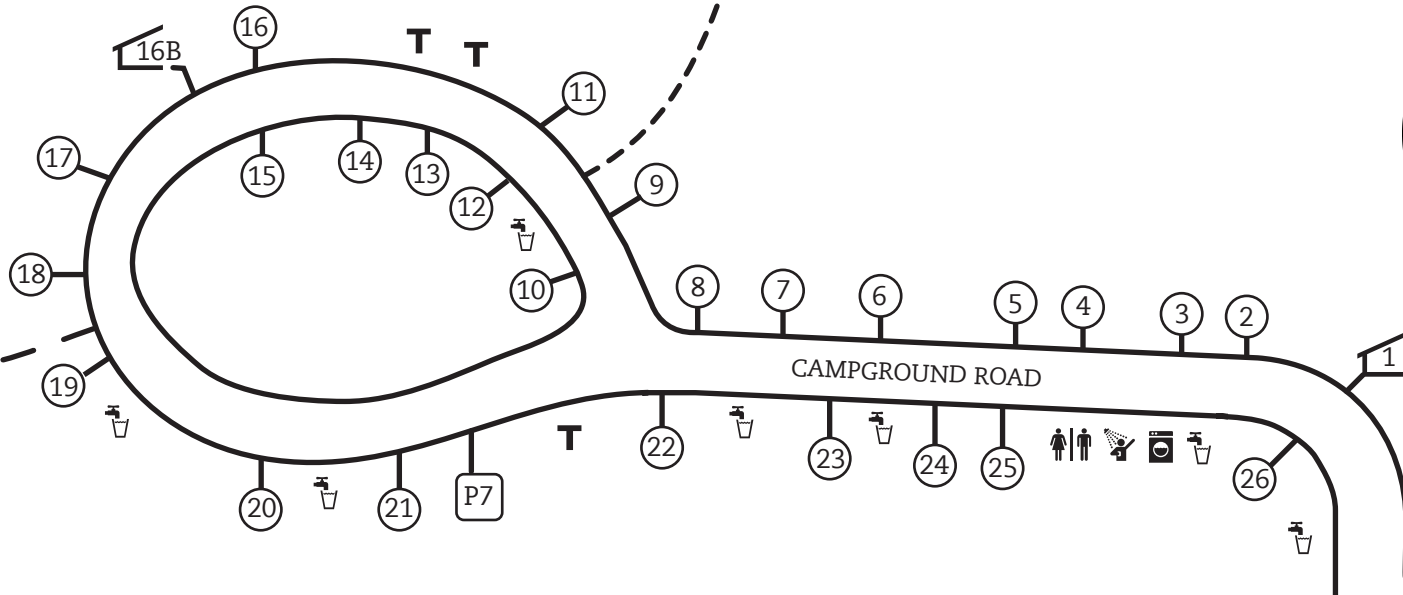


DRY RIVER CAMPGROUND - Crawford Notch State Park

About the Campground

Dry River Campground offers 36 wooded sites, and is located on Route 302, 25 miles west of North Conway and 15 miles east of Twin Mountain, in 6,000-acre Crawford Notch State Park. The campground is open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend. Walk-ins are welcome.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Flush toilets and showers are located in the campground. Water is not available after mid-October. Firewood is offered for sale. Supplies and a public telephone are available at the Willey House Snack Bar and Gift Shop three miles west of the campground.

Activities

The Crawford Notch area provides access to numerous hiking trails, waterfalls, fishing, photography, wildlife viewing and spectacular mountain views. Mount Washington Cog Railway and Auto Road, Franconia Notch, North Conway and Littleton are all within a half-hour drive of the campground.

About the Policies

- Campers with reservations may move onto their site upon arrival. Campers without reservations may move onto sites not designated as reserved.
- Envelopes for self-registration are located at the campground entrance. Please fill out, pay fee, and deposit envelope in the designated slot.
- The Park accepts cash, vouchers, money orders, or traveler's checks only.
- Check-in between 1 pm and 8 pm. Check-out by 11 am.
- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- Pets are permitted, but must be leashed and attended to at all times.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.
- Cutting standing trees and shrubs and using power saws are prohibited.
- Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.

For Your Safety

Do not invite bears or raccoons into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site by disposing of food waste properly and securing all food items in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons or destroyed by bears.
