REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, Division of Parks and Recreation, Bureau of Trails to award Recreational Trails Program grants to the organizations listed on the attached sheet (vendor codes included) in the total amount of \$670,440.70 for the development and maintenance of recreational trails and trail related safety and educational projects effective upon Governor and Council approval through December 31, 2023. 100% Federal Funds.

23-01	Milan Trail Huggers	Corridor A1 & Bog Brook Trail Maintenance	Dummer, Cambridge, Success & Berlin	Project is to perform maintenance on Corridor A1 ATV trail in Dummer/Cambridge/Success & Berlin. To access A1 with fully-loaded dump truck, Bog Brook Trail must be updated to accomodate heavy equipment. Project is in 5 parts. (1) @ west end of Bog Brook: replace 19'x16' bridge deck on existing bridge over unnamed stream. (2) @ middle of Bog Brook trail replace 36"x30' metal culvert w/ HDPE double wall culvert. Digging to replace culvert only. (3) On Corridor A1 @ east end of Black Mt. Path, brush 3.55 miles of trail, widen 2,750' of trail from 10' to 15' (trees cut, stumps pulled and buried), replace 2 15"x20' culverts, install/compact clay/gravel mix to widened section of trail. Rework 0.21 miles of steep trail to repair ruts, install/compact clay/gravel mix. (4) On Corridor A1, brush 6.63 miles of trail to expose ditchlines. Saplings cut to expose ditchlines. (5) On Corridor A1 along Success Pond Road: replace 36"x30' culvert, add/compact gravel to road around culvert to build/crown road. Add/compact clay/gravel to 1 mile of Success Pond Road where intersects A1 corridor. RTP funds: equipment rentals via service contract (excavator, dozer, dumper, roller, grader), materials (lumber, hardware, culverts, seed/hay, clay gravel mix). MATCH: volunteer labor, cash via GIA, & NHOHVA cash loan.
23-02	Groveton Trailblazers	Trail 117 Mountain View Road Maintenance	Stark	Project is to reroute 0.51 miles of the PT117 in Stark from its current location to a new location to not interfere with new subdivision being built. New trail will cut trees and be 15' wide. 1 gate to be moved but not replaced. 1 bridge to install: 14'x14' all wooden stringers/abutment spanning small intermittent brook. Bridge materials partially using GIA. RTP funds : excavators, materials: lumber for bridge, hardware, hay. Match : volunteer labor, GIA .
23-04	Powder Mill SMC	2023 Tucker Terra 1100E	New Durham	Club wants to purchase a new 2023 Tucker Terra 1100E snow groomer to replace one of the two currently owned. RTP Funds: partial tucker purchase. MATCH: GIA, club cash.
23-06	Town of Stewartstown	Creampoke Road Upgrade	Stewartstown	Project is to complete phase 3 of Creampoke Road upgrades in Stewartstown . Phase 3 includes hiring a service contractor to remove trees and pull stumps from town's ROW (50' wide), remove overburden, widen road , clean ditchlines, add gravel & compact for a total linear 1700'. RTP Funds: materials (gravel), service contract (excavator work, dump trucks), land survey of ROW boundaries. MATCH: cash, skilled labor.
23-08		Potato Road	Canaan	Project is to resurface 5000' of the Northern Rail Trail in Canaan from Potato road to north side of Indian River bridge by hiring a service contractor. Project will include: sub grade 5000' of existing trail, install 735 cubic yards of stone dust to 4" depth & compact the surface. This section has recieved complaints from bicyclists about larger, looser gravel. RTP Funds : partial service contract (equipment, labor & gravel), MATCH : cash from service contract.
23-09	Friends of the Northern Rail Trail	Rt 4 Overpass	Grafton	Project is to resurface 1000' of the Northern Rail Trail in Grafton from Rt 4 overpass near Tunnel Road by hiring a service contractor. Project will include: sub grade 1000' of existing trail, install 145 cubic yards of stone dust to 4" depth & compact the surface. This section has a narrow riding surface of 2-3 feet becuase of loose gravel. Trail has eroded under the Rt 4 overpass. Project is close to riverbank but will remain entirely above the top of the bank and no excavation will fill in the bank. RTP Funds : partial service contract (equipment, labor & gravel), MATCH : cash from service contract.
23-10	County of Cheshire	CRT Rehab Surry- Westmoreland		Project is maintenance to 7.25 miles of Cheshire Rail Trail through Surry & Westmoreland . 1 culvert to be reset and cleaned, mow sides of trail with flail mover, ditch line cleaning, tree removal in "Summit Cut" area w/ brush clearing . Summit Cut is granite ledge which will need a tree service to perform work. Some gravel to install where low. RTP Funds : equipment rentals, culvert, gravel, partial service contract with tree service, equipment fuel. MATCH : volunteer labor, cash
23-11	Town of Swanzey	ART Rehab South End, CRT Mt. Huggins Drainage	Swanzey	Project is to perform drainage ditchline cleaning and mowing on 4 miles of the Ashuelot Rail Trail in Swanzey and the Cheshire Rail Trail near Mt. Higgings Drive in Swanzey needs a 15"x40' culvert replaced (need DOT approval with DOT culvert specs). Swanzey DPW will provide free labor to operate machine rentals. RTP Funds: Equipment rentals (excavators, mower, dump truck, chipper), Materials (culvert, gravel, fill). Match: town DPW skilled labor operating machines.

23-12	Town of Hopkinton	Kearsarge Ave. to Library	Hopkinton	Project is to use old RR corridor to create a 1400' universally-accessible connection from the schools to the library and town fields in Hopkinton . Service contractors will be used for majority of project to cut trees , add fill, level out surface and install one 20'x15" plastic culvert . Some DPW labor and some volunteer labor to clean up. Gate will be installed at Kearsarge Ave to control access. RTP Funds : service contract to build trail. MATCH : service contract for tree clearing, materials (gravel, stone dust, culvert, STEEL gate, posts), volunteer labor & own work force. SPN permit.
23-13	Town of Walpole	Restoration on CRT	Walpole	Project is to address drainage issues and reclaim an old parking area on the 7 mile stretch of the Cheshire Rail Trail in Walpole. There are 5 total drainage sites to address and at each site, drainage ditches will be cleaned and have trail crowned with gravel and compacted. Total length of ditch cleaning is less then half a mile for all sites combined. Specific additional drainage tasks wil occur at (D1): add 24" culvert ~ 50' before the washout behind the vet clinic, (D2): 6' wide by 2' deep drop pool dug and lined with crushed stone (drop will break momentum of seasonal stream that washes onto trail surface and will direct water to drainage ditch), (D3): pile of rocks fallen from cliff will be removed from drainage ditch, (D4): an existing surface drainage channel will be repaired and lined with crushed stone between outlet of an existing culvert under Rt 12 and a box culvert under rail trail. (P1): reclaim an old parking area on the side of River Road S. Hand tools and volunteer labor will be used for reclaiming parking area by removing saplings. RTP Funds: equipment rental (brush hogger), service contract (equipment, labor, materials: culvert, gravel). MATCH: volunteer labor, cash from town.
23-14	City of Lebanon	Rail Trail Bridge on NRT	Lebanon	Project is to replace decking and railings on bridge #134.50 on the Northern Rail Trail near the Lebanon/Enfield border . No stringer or abutment work. Bridge is 12' wide x 93' and spans the Mascoma River. City will dispose of materials at city dump. RTP Funds : service contract for JC Builders (under \$10K), materials (lumber & hardware). MATCH : city owned equipment (dump truck, F-250 4x4 truck) and 2 city laborers, volunteer labor.
23-18	Audubon Society of NH	All Persons Trail Phase 2	Concord	Project is in 2 phases: Phase 1 is to build a rough out of a universal trail at at the McLane Audubon center in Concord in summer of 2022. In 2023, Phase 2 will be to upgrade this same trail to be universally accesible . Project will be completely contracted out. Several donations expected for the match portion of project. Project phase 2 tasks include: excavate 6-8" down for 2000' of trail, add rough stone, add 3/4" gravel, add stone dust, crown and compact trail. Where needed, add geotextile fabric. Replace a basic "boardwalk" (35'x3.5') over depression with longer/wider wooden structure. RTP Funds: partial payment to contractor. MATCH: Cash for contractor, volunteer time, Audubon staff time.
23-20	Randolph Mountain Club	Short Line Trail	Randolph/WMNF	Project is to address erosional problems on ~ 104' of the Short Line Trail in the WMNF (just south of Randolph). Tasks include building cross drains, stairs, retaining walls and step stones. All constructed with rock found on site. RTP Funds: RMC own force labor. MATCH: RMC field supervisor labor, volunteers.
23-21	Society for the Protection of NH forests	Mt. Major Sustainablity Upgrade Phase 2	Alton	Project is to reroute 1,927' of the Main Trail that goes up Mt. Major in Alton . The existing trail was a "fall line" trail and has deteriorated to a point were repairs are no longer reasonable to protect the environment. The new trail section can be built sustainabily to accomodate the large volume of hikers. The new trail will be 6' wide and use grade reversals, crushed stone surface, stone steps, cribbing, gargoyles, etc. Contractor will use equipment such as: mini-excavator, tracked crawler, tracked skid steer, loader, ditch witch, roller, compactor. Trail will be built to create a "wandering through the forest" feel using a "rolling contour" design and will try to keep a 10% slope and not exceed 15-20% slope. Closure of the existing trail will occur after this project is complete and seperate from this request. RTP Funds : partial pro crew contract. MATCH : SPNHF staff time, cash.

23-25	Town of Hooksett	Hooksett Riverwalk Trail Phase 4	Hooksett	Project is to create a better trail (somewhat "new") on an existing grass trail along the Merrimack River in Hooksett . This will be part of Hooksett's Riverwalk system and on the old RR bed. Project will excavate 2,740'x12'x1' to remove topsoil and add gravel to create a stable level trail. Project includes a 24'x12' wooden bridge with concrete abutments on an offshoot trail that leads to an active corn field. 1 culvert in project area but will not be disturbed. RTP Funds : partial service contract. MATCH : cash
