**GRANT-IN-AID  
 OHRV STORM DAMAGE REQUEST FORM**

Per Ncr 844.03: OHRV clubs can apply for **Storm Damage Project** funds to repair unforeseen damage resulting from weather events or snow melt. Some examples of a Storm Damage Project are: necessary repairs/replacement of a bridge that has been destroyed/damaged/moved, necessary repairs to a trail/culvert, removal of downed/damaged trees that are on, or in danger of falling on, a trail. Any project must be approved by the Bureau of Trails before beginning the project. The Bureau of Trails will review and notify the club/political subdivision of Bureau's decision.

A Storm Damage Project is caused by extreme weather and found by the club after a weather event or snow melt of a current GIA award period. These projects are unexpected and **must be repaired prior** to the club's existing **contract ending May 31**. Priority should be for the main trails necessary to keep a trail system open or connected to another club's trail system.

Storm Damage Project awarded funds cannot be utilized for any other purpose/project. If no damage occurs, or a club does not use all awarded funds for an approved Storm Damage Project, funds will roll back into the GIA fund pool for future awards.

If Storm Damage Projects are on the same trail within the same area, it is one Storm Damage Project. If Projects are on the same trail, but in different areas of the trail, or on different trails, they are multiple Storm Damage Projects.

Storm Damage Projects have a cap of \$10,000 per club per GIA award period. Items covered/percentages will be the same as GIA Rules allow for regular projects during the current GIA award period.

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**GRANT IN AID PROGRAM**  
**LANDOWNER PROJECT PERMISSION FORM**

Per Ncr 843.06 Landowner Permission. All OHRV clubs, snowmobile clubs and political subdivisions seeking grant-in-aid for trail construction or maintenance shall obtain written landowner permission. Written permission shall not be required for summer grading and winter grooming operations, provided that the trail administrator verifies by signing the grant-in-aid application that permission has been received.

In order to receive Grant-In-Aid funding from the Bureau of Trails, all projects proposed on State of New Hampshire, United States Government, Town, or private property must have approval by the landowner or land manager. This form is to be completed and submitted with a club's GIA Application for grant funding for proposed projects.

Grant approval by the Bureau of Trails DOES NOT constitute consent by a landowner/land manager for any work to be done.
